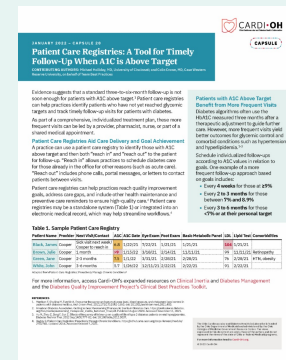


Patient Care Registries: A Tool for Timely Follow-Up When A1C is Above Target
